ABSU, AASU demand impartial inquiry

A joint delegation team of All Bodo Students Union (ABSU) and All Assam Students Union (AASU) led by Promod Boro, president of ABSU visited Balajan Tinali bazar on Monday in Kokrajhar district to take stock about indiscriminate firing.

Students union delegation visited all firing sites along the bazar and interacted with victims ([/taxonomy/term/1810](#)) family member and bazar residents

which claimed 14 civilian and 18 others received serious injured.

Students delegation condemned the incident and termed unfortunate for the state (/taxonomy/term/2332) . The situation should be investigated impartial and punished involved culprits, students union demanded.

Boro, president of ABSU alleged that government has totally failed to check life and property of citizens.

'Government has failed to provide safe and security for the citizens in the region of which why innocent peoples facing severe hardships. Inquiry should be impartial while making authentic investigation into indiscriminate firing in the bazar', said Boro.

He has condemning the incident termed that situations be checked properly to nab involved culprits so that such incident could not be repeated in near future.

Dipangko Kumar Nath, president of AASU expressed serious concern over (/taxonomy/term/2166) inhuman penetrated by militant outfit said the government should take stern step against (/taxonomy/term/1929) involved militant organization. He demanded investigation should be conducted impartial while stepping to check terror attack on bazar.

'Government should ensure proper rehabilitation of affected peoples who lost their lives in the attack besides making suitable situation in the state (/taxonomy/term/2332) so that such inhuman activities could not be repeated in the state (/taxonomy/term/2332)', Nath demanded.

A seven member delegation team of Assam Sahitya Sabha (/taxonomy/term/46) led by Dharendra Nath Adhikari, assistant (/taxonomy/term/1654) secretary of Sahitya Sabha (/taxonomy/term/46) visited Balajan Tinali bazar in Kokrajhar.

Sahitya Sabha (/taxonomy/term/46) delegation met victims (/taxonomy/term/1810) family members and affected citizens in the bazar.

Sabha expressed concern on firing attacked and demanded proper action against (/taxonomy/term/1929) incident.
