

Akhil's protest resembles Maoist tactics, says Tarun Gogoi



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Assam's hatric Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi, at a press conference on Tuesday said that Akhil Gogoi's protest on 22nd June, against eviction drive resembles to maoist tactics and this was evident from the fact that the protestors were carrying sticks and stone on their hands. Though the Chief Minister didn't link directly Akhil Gogoi to the maoist, he did say that there are members in the Krisak Mukti Sangram Samity organization having maoist links. He had referred about two persons that were arrested last year.

Whatever may be, now basking in the glory of recent election result, Tarun Gogoi is least bothered about any opposition, be it from the media or from Akhil Gogoi “After all the people will vote for me” he says. Thanks to the great opposition of the state.
