Following the party's poor show, Bora dashed off a letter to All India Congress Committee(AICC) President Sonia Gandhi tendering his resignation. The Congress leader tumbled down and lost from the Gohpur seat to BJP's Utpal Borah by a margin of over 29,000 votes.
