

Beware China slogan in Itanagar



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Thousands of people hit the streets in [Itanagar](#) on Monday alleging the unilateral [claim](#) of the Chinese authority [over](#) some places in [Arunachal Pradesh](#).

Led by the All [Arunachal Pradesh Students Union \(AAPSU\)](#), the protesters thronged the [city](#) at 11 in the morning and took out the street procession in protest [against](#) the illegitimate by the neighbouring country.

Holding placards and banners in their hands, the protestors shouted vande- mataram, Bharat mata ki jay, we are Indians, Haye-haye Chinese government etc. and burnt the effigy of Chinese [President](#) Xi Jinping.

In his brief address, [AAPSU](#) president Hawa Bagnag said, "[Arunachal](#) is integral part of [India](#), this frontier [state](#) was never been part of China nor we want to be rule under China, we are Indian and we will remain Indian."

He slammed China for interfering in the internal matters of [India](#) saying that the Arunachalee are ready for any consequence to [fight](#) for the Indian [state](#). “We will never fade an inch of our land to china. Though our facial structure are same but there are other countries like Korea, Japan, Indonesia etc who have mongoloid feature but they are not Chinese nor are we,” he said..

He maintained that nobody writes or speaks in Chinese in [Arunachal](#). “We are hardcore Indian and hardcore Hindi speaking people of [India](#).

Further concerning on poor developmental activities in border areas,” said the [AAPSU President](#) who lamented that [state](#) & central government should ponder up developing the border.

[AAPSU](#) general secretary Tobom Dai slammed the Chinese authority for interfering in internal matters of [India](#) and illegally claiming [Arunachal as](#) their territory.

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
