CM feels heat of boiling border

Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi (/taxonomy/term/512) felt the heat of a boiling border (/taxonomy/term/665) situation when he was on a stock-taking visit (/taxonomy/term/767) on Monday.

As the chief minister's convoy arrived in Uriamghat (/taxonomy/term/1493) area at 11-30 (/taxonomy/term/1474) in the morning, angry protesters shouted Gogoi (/taxonomy/term/512) Go Back slogans.

A section of the protesters asked him to immediately leave Uriamghat (/taxonomy/term/1493) alleging his failure to deal with the decade old row with Nagaland.

Police resorted to blank firing to disperse a group of protesters as they targeted the chief minister. After a brief discussion with top ranked police (/taxonomy/term/762) and civil officials, the chief minister left the spot.
