Ex-ULFA aikhya mancha protests government's move

The ex-ULFA ([/taxonomy/term/124](#)) cadres are dead opposed to the government's move to grant ([/taxonomy/term/2065](#)) citizenship ([/taxonomy/term/2368](#)) to Hindu Bangaldeshis in Assam. A general meeting of the Ex-ULFA ([/taxonomy/term/124](#)) aikhya mancha was held at Dimalgaon community ([/taxonomy/term/2084](#)) hall in Kokrajhar on Sunday.

A new Kokrajhar district committee of ex-ULFA (/taxonomy/term/124) Aikhya Mancha was formed with Suresh Roy (/taxonomy/term/1639) as (/taxonomy/term/2291) president and Hemen Roy (/taxonomy/term/1639) as (/taxonomy/term/2291) secretary in the meeting. Nearly 16,000 ex-ULFA (/taxonomy/term/124) men are still in the state (/taxonomy/term/2332) of Assam, who were surrendered to the since 1992 till today. The surrendered cadres have been facing several hardship and problems since surrendered. Though they have placed demands (/taxonomy/term/2467) to the government for welfare (/taxonomy/term/2003) of the surrendered cadres, but could not meet solution.

Kalpajyoti Neog (/taxonomy/term/2231), president of Ex-ULFA (/taxonomy/term/124) Aikhya Manch, Assam said that the mancha would be protesting the government's move to grant (/taxonomy/term/2065) citizenship (/taxonomy/term/2368) rights (/taxonomy/term/1990) to the Hindu Bangladeshis. The persons who reached in Assam after March 25 of 1977, they must be deported from Assam at any costs', he said.

Sunil Nath, former spokesman of ULFA (/taxonomy/term/124) has reiterated the demand made from ULFA (/taxonomy/term/124) said that struggle would be continued till achieved of goal.

'We fought for seeking rights (/taxonomy/term/1990), but still today dreams could not be reached fruitfully. Our struggle for our demand would be continued in the country', Nath said.
