From early in the morning on Monday, defying soaring prices fish and meat markets were teeming with customers to prepare for the feast with near and dear ones. Several places held community fishing for the uruka feast.

Mejis are being erected in the public places near the bhelghars made of staws and stubbles to be set afire at dawn on Tuesday to offer pujas to the firegod. Varieties of home-made pastries, larus, beaten rice, hurums are flooding every household to be served on this occasion.

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
