Insufficient ex-gratia amount!

The All Adivasi ([/taxonomy/term/2018](#)) Students Association of Assam(AASAA) is unhappy with the ex-gratia and rehabilitation grants of the government for the family members of the recent carnage ([/taxonomy/term/2011](#)) victims

([/taxonomy/term/1810](#)).

The organization further demanded hike of Rs 20 lakh each to the deceased victim and Rs.5 lakh to the injured persons during carnage ([/taxonomy/term/2011](#)).

Talking to Assam Times, AASAA leader ([/taxonomy/term/1820](#)) Satyanath Tudu said that the association and affected peoples were not satisfied with the ex-gratia and rehabilitation grants of the government.

He said the government announced just Rs. 5 lakh to the deceased families and Rs. 50,000 and Rs. 22,000 against (/taxonomy/term/1929) the houses burnt down completely and partially.

The AASAA also submitted a memorandum to DC demanding hike ex-gratia and rehabilitation related issues for the peoples those who were affected during the carnage (/taxonomy/term/2011) and post carnage (/taxonomy/term/2011).

Notably, Deputy Commissioner Thaneswar Malakar said that the government of Assam has announced to provide Rs. 5 lakh to next to the deceased families, Rs. 50,000 to the families whose houses are burnt completely and Rs. 22,000 to the families whose houses are burnt partially.
