

King cobra rescued & rehabilitated



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A 13 feet King Cobra was rescued by Dulu Bora of Green Guard Nature Organization near 17 no. line quarters of Lungsung Tea Estate, Karbi foothills, near Chapanalala, Nagaon, on Saturday. It was later released back to the wild in the presence of forest officials in less than a mile from its place of rescue. The King Cobra was first spotted at a residence at the 17 No. line quarters of the Lungsung Tea Estate. Later when the people gathered there, it slithered out to a nearby ditch. The manager of the estate informed Bora of Green Guard Nature Organization. Bora successfully managed to coax the snake into a sack. Meanwhile others from Green Guard Nature Organization informed forest staff and once they arrived, they accompanied Dulu to the forests nearby and released the King Cobra, which promptly disappeared into the vegetation.
