Equally significant is the plan to integrate modern digital media systems within the premises. In today's technology-driven era, such innovations are essential to enhancing the visitor experience. The proposed digital features will allow visitors to take interactive selfies with the Bharat Ratna awardee, explore his songs through immersive interfaces, and engage with his works in innovative formats. These initiatives are particularly aimed at attracting younger audiences, who are more inclined towards digital and experiential learning.

Beyond engagement, this digital transformation also holds significant educational value. By presenting Dr. Hazarika's songs, writings, and ideas through modern technology, the initiative ensures that his contributions are not confined to archives or textbooks. Instead, they become part of a living, interactive narrative that fosters appreciation, curiosity, and a deeper understanding among visitors of all age groups.

Another important component of the plan is the construction of an open stage within the Tirtha complex. This space will serve as a platform for cultural performances, musical tributes, literary discussions, and community programmes. It reflects Dr. Hazarika's own belief in art as a powerful medium for dialogue and social transformation. With regular events and performances, the open stage will help transform the site into a centre of continuous cultural vibrancy.

To ensure sustained development and active engagement, the Government also proposes the formation of a dedicated Board of Directors. This body will oversee the management and long-term vision of the Tirtha, ensuring that it remains vibrant and relevant throughout the year. The Board is expected to organise regular "Sudhakantha Discussions", seminars, and cultural interactions that celebrate and critically engage with Dr. Hazarika's enduring legacy.

Such institutional support is crucial to preventing the space from becoming dormant. Instead, it will evolve into a hub of intellectual exchange and cultural dialogue. By involving artists, scholars, students, and the public, the initiative will foster a sense of shared ownership and collective participation.

The Government of Assam's commitment to this endeavour reflects a broader recognition of the importance of cultural preservation in the state's developmental journey. In an increasingly globalised world, safeguarding and promoting iconic cultural figures like Dr. Bhupen Hazarika is essential—not only for preserving identity but also for strengthening cultural tourism and economic growth.

By prioritising the preservation and promotion of his memory, the government reaffirms its dedication to honouring a personality who introduced Assam and its rich heritage to the world.
