

Steps to boost border security



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The [Assam](#) government will improve infrastructure at the [Assam-Nagaland border](#) outposts. [Security forces](#) deployed there would get sophisticated equipment.

This was what a crucial [meeting](#) chaired by chief secretary JS Khosla decided hours after two [more](#) bodies were found after the violence along the Nagaland [border](#) which took the toll to 11.

The [meeting](#) decided to repair the 81 [border](#) outposts and provide additional infrastructure like barracks, fencing, bunkers and facilities for water and sanitation.

The work will be executed by the [Assam](#) Police Housing Corporation Ltd. under supervision of the state home department.

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
