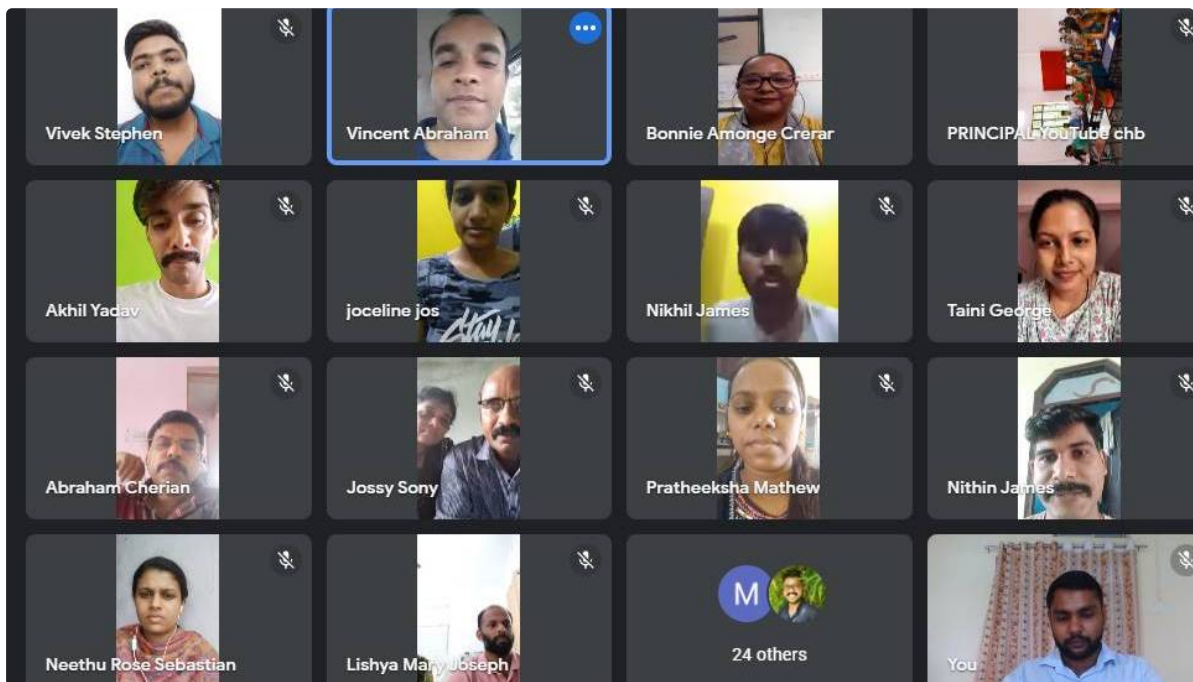


Virtual Teacher Enhancement Programme held



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The senior students of Social Work, Assam Don Bosco University (ADBUs) in collaboration with Christu Jyothi Academy, Kannauj and St. Paul's Higher Secondary School, Chhibramau, Kannauj organized a one-day Virtual Teacher Enhancement Programme on 'Effective Delivery of Education through use of Technology' for teachers of high schools and a 'Career Guidance Workshop' for high schools and higher secondary schools students today 19th July 2021.
