The 5th World [Elephant](#) Day was observed today at Nagaon, Assam, with an [elephant](#) fodder plantation program and an art and terracotta competition. In the morning, 78 saplings of Bheem Kol, a giant banana species relished by elephants, were planted at the Karbi foothills [elephant](#) corridor near Lungsung by a Green Guard team including Dulu [Bora](#), Satyam Nayak, Sanjay Nayak and others.

In the afternoon, 30 students of the Chitralkha Chitrakon Vidyalaya at Chapanal, led by art teacher Jyotika Bhuyan, participated in a drawing and terracotta sculpture competition.
